Compound sentence

A compound sentence is made up of two
or more independent clauses.

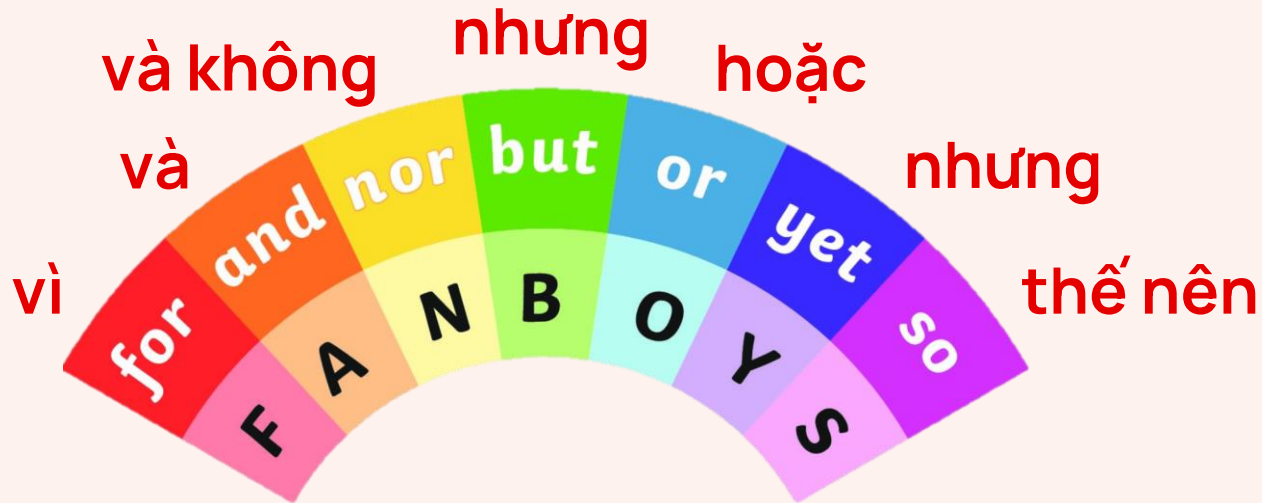
We can use a **coordinating conjunction: for, and, but, or, so** to join in independent clauses.

Mai bought
many books,

for

Mai likes
reading.

Mai đã mua nhiều sách **vì** Mai thích đọc sách.



We can use **a conjunctive adverb: however, therefore, otherwise** to join in independent clauses.

Mark is hard
working

; therefore,

Mark usually gets high
scores on exams.

Mark rất chăm chỉ, **thế nên** anh ấy luôn đạt điểm cao trong các bài kiểm tra.

...; **therefore**,...: thế nên

...; **however**,...: tuy nhiên

...; **otherwise**,...: nếu không thì
