REMEMBER!

When we want to describe changes, we can use adjectives to modify nouns and adverbs to modify verbs:

Adjectives	Adverbs
dramatic	dramatically
considerable	considerably
significant	significantly
slight	slightly
gradual	gradually

Example:

- There have been *considerable* changes in the last decade.
- Our environment has been gradually polluted.
